HOW WILL I BE ASSESSED?

In Year 11, you will be assessed in the four language skills:

Listening:	1 examination in June (25%)
Reading:	1 examination in June (25%)
Speaking:	1 speaking exam in March/April (25%)
Writing:	1 examination in June (25%)

FUTURE OPPORTUNITIES

A foreign language qualification opens the door to a variety of specific careers such as translation, interpreting or teaching, and it is a prerequisite for working with any international firm and in the travel and tourism industry. Furthermore, a qualification in a modern foreign language is viewed very favourably when applying to University.
