Why our Sixth Form?

We will provide you with the care, guidance, information and support required for this level of study whilst still recognising that every student is unique. We provide a supportive learning environment where information, advice and guidance is personalised to recognise and cater for the needs and talents of each student.



We understand and know how important it is to support you as you continue to grow academically and personally to become an increasingly independent learner. Sixth Form teachers and tutors work hard to enable you to develop the skills you require, whether this is for Higher Education, Further Education, an apprenticeship, training or employment.

We are proud of the stimulating learning environment we provide alongside the care and support of a dedicated team of staff. Academic challenge is important and this will take place in a happy, safe and supportive environment. You will be encouraged to take increasing responsibility for your learning and progress. We also expect you to develop your independent learning skills; a requirement for this level of study and a skill that will stand you in good stead in the future.

Life in our Sixth Form offers students increased responsibility and the freedom to manage their time effectively. There are fantastic opportunities to develop leadership skills, through our programme of co-curricular activities.

We have an active Sixth Form Council which enables students to develop their character and confidence in leading on important aspects of the Sixth Form to ensure we continue to meet your needs. We expect students to take part in a Personal Development Activity (PDA) such as helping our younger students with their reading, supporting lessons or coaching a sporting team.

Students have access to dedicated facilities including the 'Village' and Study Room; in addition students in the Sixth Form are offered the privilege of working independently in our 'open all hours' canteen, in the quiet M Block foyer and in the Space 4 Learning. Laptop and computer access is plentiful, and the Common Room offers a space for interactive work, as well as being a recreational area for social times.

Support for Success

Tutoring in the Sixth Form

You will be part of a Sixth Form tutor group that will be made up of Year 12 and Year 13 students to develop a sense of community and to help form positive and supportive relationships. You will see your tutor daily to ensure you have the support and guidance to be both happy and successful.



Support in the Sixth Form

There is a good network of support for you in the Sixth Form. We also know that the link between home and school is fundamental to your success. We are keen to develop strong and positive links with parents/carers.

Wider partnerships include external agencies, local businesses, Higher Education institutions, charities and Business Mentors; these are well established and prove to be important in helping our students manage their studies.

PDA and Leadership

Students in the Sixth Form are encouraged to develop confidence and interpersonal skills, by taking part in activities with younger students (for example, paired reading, STEM events, sports team coaching) and with peers, on programmes such as Ready2Lead.

How do you apply via Applicaa?

Please complete our online application form; a link for Applicaa is available on the Sixth Form area of our website.

The form will ask you some details so that we can contact you quickly about your application, and you will be asked to select the subjects that you wish to study in the Sixth Form, along with a 'reserve' subject choice. For 2025 applications to the Sixth Form, there are no option blocks; we aim to satisfy as many students' subject combination choices as possible and options will be confirmed in the Spring term of Year 11.

For external students who would be new to Mark Rutherford School, a short reference from a member of staff at your current school is required as part of your application.

Once we have received your completed application, an offer will be made to you for a place in the Sixth Form, via the Applicaa platform.

Offers

Once your application is complete and submitted, the Sixth Form team will be able to offer you a place in Year 12, based on you achieving the published entry criteria for your chosen subjects. We request that you confirm the acceptance of your offer via the Applicaa platform.

Interview

All applicants will be informally interviewed by a senior member of teaching staff – the interviews take place during the Spring term of Year 11. This is a key part of the application process as it is an opportunity to discuss your subject choices and future plans. It is important that we ensure you have made the right choices for you.



Induction

All students who are offered a place are expected to attend Sixth Form Induction in the Summer term. It is important that you experience taster lessons in your chosen subjects to ensure you have made the right decisions and also understand the expectations of a Sixth Form student at Mark Rutherford School.

Enrolment

This will take place once GCSE and vocational subject results have been published.

For most students the transition into the Sixth Form is an easy one.

All students complete enrolment via Applicaa in order to be signed onto their chosen courses.

Sixth Form Entry Criteria

Our **preferred** entry criteria for the Sixth Form are **5 GCSEs at Grade 4 or above**, which must include English **or** Maths. Individual Sixth Form subjects have additional entry criteria as shown below*:

Please note the following:

1. Some of the subjects offered may be subject to change based on the number of students applying from the applications received.
2. *Where a student has not taken a subject at GCSE level (eg Art, Dance, Geography etc) the individual subject criteria are a guideline only; students can be accepted onto courses based on their overall suite of results.
3. Applied Science, Health and Social Care and Information Technology courses follow the new AAQ specifications, which replace the previous BTEC courses. Each AAQ is equivalent to one A Level. Further information on AAQs will be released by the government in January 2025; information is correct at the time of publication and students and parents/carers will be updated accordingly.
